With Associate Professor Jane Munro

Associate Professor Jane Munro is a paediatric rheumatologist at the Royal Children's Hospital and lead of Rheumatology research at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute. She was the Head of Rheumatology for nearly ten years and stepped down from that position in 2020. She leads the ANZCLARITY Juvenile Arthritis study and Chief Investigator on the Australian Arthritis and Autoimmune Biobank (A3B3) study, is CI on two large collaborative MRFF grants and one CRE.



In 2020 she co-founded Pandemic Kindness Movement. During 2021-2023 she worked as a senior medical Adviser in the Office of the DCHO at the Victorian Department of Health. Jane enjoys juggling roles as doctor, researcher, private practice owner, director, advocate, writer and mum. Jane is passionate about improving clinician wellbeing and strongly believes in the role of building community, storytelling, spreading kindness and the need for health systems change.
